Dear Resident,

We are grateful to each of you, and our Staff, for helping our campus remain COVID-free. Living Care is now making plans to slowly and safely reopen our campus to some of the types of activities we have all enjoyed so much in the past, albeit in a somewhat simplified format to start. We look forward to when we can enjoy meals together again, use the Café and Fitness Center, attend Chapels and Bible Studies, play Bean Bag Baseball, and all the other activities that make life at Living Care so special.

Implementing this plan to slowly reopen our campus, however, places an even greater responsibility on each Resident to follow safety guidelines in order for us to be successful.

Here are four important thoughts to keep in mind:

1. Living Care is trying to maintain a reasonable balance between trying to protect our Residents by preventing the spread of the Corona Virus and trying to not restrict too many freedoms our Residents enjoy. As we slowly lessen the restrictions on gatherings, we encourage Residents to follow our safe visiting guidelines so the Corona Virus does not spread through our campus.
2. It is more important for Residents and Staff at Living Care to practice safe visiting guidelines than for other organizations because all our Residents are in what's considered a 'highly vulnerable' group simply due to being seniors. In general, the health impact of COVID-19 will likely be far more serious for our Residents than for younger individuals.
3. Living Care needs every Resident to be a Good Neighbor by following our safety guidelines. The more Residents who choose to not follow these precautions, the more likely it is that the Corona Virus could spread to and through our campus. Please remember that a Resident can spread the virus to their neighbors before they notice any symptoms themselves. Due to this, it is critically important to practice safety precautions at all times whether feeling ill or not.
4. Living Care expects each Resident to make good decisions and to act responsibly for the benefit of their neighbors. Living Care Staff cannot 'police' every Resident's actions. We can only, with a kind and gracious spirit, remind and request that Residents respectfully follow the safety guidelines that will help protect our neighbors and friends.
