Dear Residents,

We are now one week into August and we are celebrating that we still have no resident cases of coronavirus on our campus. We are so thankful for the many months we've kept this campus safe and for all of your cooperation!

As we continue moving forward with slowly and carefully loosening restrictions on campus, and as we prepare in a few weeks to allow some small outdoor visits, I'd like to formally let you know about some changes in our guidelines for activities within the apartment buildings.

First, let me reiterate that whether you are inside the building or outside on the grounds, our expectation, in accordance with Local and State guidelines, is that when you are outside of your apartment, you wear your mask. This is especially important if you cannot maintain 6 feet of distance from another individual. When walking on the pathway it is permissible to remove your mask if you are alone, but please carry it with you in case you encounter others. If people around you are not abiding by these guidelines, we'd ask that you protect yourself by making sure you personally are following social distancing guidelines and wearing your mask.

### **Effective Monday Aug. 10<sup>th</sup>**

- Walking inside your apartment building is permissible to help avoid the heat outdoors.
- More than one person may use the laundry room at a time. We'd ask that you give each other space, social distance and wear your masks. As such, in buildings that adopted a voluntary laundry room schedule due to COVID guidelines, this is no longer in effect.
- You may borrow books from the library in your building. The computer lab is also open. You should wash your hands before and after using the computers or any common items.
- If you choose to, you may work on puzzles or play cards in the common areas of your buildings. You should wear a mask while doing these activities. If others around you are not following these guidelines, you should protect yourself by refraining from playing with them. Please wash your hands before and after participating in these activities.

We look forward to safely offering some more flexibility in activities and access on our campus.
